Alnus rhombifolia White Alder

TREE - deciduous.

10 to 90' high, 20' spread.

Fast-growing - straight trunk and tiered branches.

Dark green, finely toothed leaves.

Flowers are chartreuse catkins
— winter to spring.

Gray bark.

Small cone-like fruit.

Native habitat: Riparian areas below 9000' — throughout California west of the desert areas, to Washington, Idaho.

Full sun to part shade.

Frost resistant.

Can adapt but prefers moistureretaining soils.

Water 4 /month to keep soil moist.

Does well combined with lawn. Looks good against a dark background.
