

Chilopsis linearis 'Burgundy'

Burgundy Desert Willow

TREE - winter deciduous.

15-25' high, to 15' wide.

Willow-like, weeping, typically multi-trunked.

Leaves linear, curved 5-10"

Flowers in terminal racemes, fragrant, vibrant shades of burgundy.

Native Habitat: Sandy desert washes.
Northern Mexico to Utah, New Mexico, Arizona and southeast California.

Cultivar propagated from cuttings.

Full sun.

Best in sandy soils, but tolerates less well-drained soils.

Does best with moderate summer water:
1 - 2 x/month in summer.

Fast grower.

Attracts hummingbirds and bees.

Can be pruned to single trunk.

Slope stabilizer
