Chilopsis linearis **Desert Willow**

LARGE SHRUB, SMALL TREE - winter deciduous. 10 - 20' high, 15' spread. Twisting trunks and shaggy bark with age. Leaves slender, drooping, willow-like. Flowers large, orchid-like - April to August.

Color varies from white, pink, rose to lavender marked with purple. Violet-scented.

Native habitat: desert washes below 5000' - California deserts to Utah, New Mexico and northern Mexico.

Full sun. Tolerates temperatures well below freezing. Requires summer irrigation $(2 - 4 \times / \text{month})$. Needs good drainage.

Good slope stabilizer due to rapid growth of roots. Good wildlife cover. Little care of any kind needed, but can be pruned.
