## Diplacus longiflorus (Mimulus longiflorus, Mimulus aurantiacus var. longiflorus)

## Sticky Monkeyflower

WOODY SUBSHRUB
To 5' high, 3' spread.
Sticky leaves, hairy on underside.
Flowers pale yellow — March June.

Native habitat: coastal sage scrub, chaparral — hills, foothills, canyons up to 7500' in central and southern California, including Channel Islands, and to northern Baja California.

Full sun.
Needs well-drained soil.
Water while growing and
blooming. No water when
dormant.

Good for dry border or foundation planting.
Attracts hummingbirds, butterflies.
