## Dodecatheon clevelandii Padre's Shooting Star

PERENNIAL, deciduous, dying back after rains.
To 12" high.
Leaves oval, to 6" long, in rosette.
Flowers in inflorescence, white to magenta, nodding, on stem up to 12" long - January to April.

Native habitat: usually in open grassland; coastal sage scrub, chaparral - throughout most of California to Baja California; 0 - 2500'.

Full sun to part shade. Frost tolerant. No watering needed.

Use to give early color. One of the first flowers of the year. Very attractive.
