

Dudleya attenuata
Tapertip Live-forever

SUCCULENT - evergreen

6 to 10" high, 6 to 10" spread.

Round elongated leaves, green with gray-blue cast.

Flowers white on stems to 1' long - May to June.

Native habitat: coastal sage scrub, chaparral - coastal bluffs
below 150'; San Diego county coast to northern Baja
California.

Full sun to part shade.

Drought tolerant. Water sparingly.

Good for rock gardens and containers.

Flowers attract hummingbirds and butterflies.
