## Encelia californica 'El Dorado' El Dorado Sunflower

PERENNIAL SUBSHRUB — evergreen.

3' high, 4' spread, but can grow to 5' in some conditions.

Bright green leaves.

Spectacular bloom of yellow daisy flowers, about 2-3" diameter — February to June, and later with watering.

Horticultural selection. Native species is common in Southern California.

Full sun to part shade.
Well drained soils.
Tolerates coastal conditions.

Excellent on slopes for erosion control.

Combine with *Salvias, Ceanothus* or *Rhus*.

Recommend cutting back to the ground annually to keep from getting too woody or leggy.
