

Eriogonum crocatum
Conejo Buckwheat



PERENNIAL, SUBSHRUB - evergreen.

12 - 18" high.

Small, round white leaves. Woolly white stems.

Flowers intense sulfur yellow, in umbels - April to July.

Native habitat: rocky slopes in coastal sage scrub, 150 to 500'
- limited to Conejo Grade, Ventura County.

Full sun.

Well-drained soil.

Little or no summer water.

Striking flower and foliage, but tends to be short-lived.

Good as an accent and in borders, rock gardens and containers.

RARE — CNPS List: 1B.2

(Rare, threatened or endangered in California and elsewhere.

Fairly endangered in California)
