

Eriogonum fasciculatum 'Dana Point'

Dana Point Buckwheat

SHRUB, WOODY PERENNIAL,
GROUNDCOVER - evergreen.
1 to 3' high, to 5'+ wide, often
spreading, non-erect branches.
Small, narrow leaves in bunches.
Heads or clusters of very small
whitish to pale pink flowers on
leafless stalks in mid-summer.
Flowers turn rich rusty brown.



Horticultural selection from Dana
Point headlands, Orange County.
Full sun to part shade.
Frost resistant.
Can take heavy soil.
Little or no water once established.
Can be drought deciduous with no
water; stays green if irrigated in
summer.



Grows rapidly.
Good erosion control.
Can be cut back or topped to give lower
ground cover effect.
Attracts many species of insects including
butterflies.
