## *Fallugia paradoxa* Apache Plume

SMALL TO MEDIUM SHRUB deciduous in drought and cold.
3 - 8' high, 6 - 10' wide.
Twiggy with tiny leaves.
Small clusters of single, white, roselike flowers - May to June.
Clusters of pinkish, feathery seed plumes.

Native habitat: joshua tree woodland, pinyon juniper woodland - dry rocky slopes and sandy plains, 3500 to 7500' - mountains of high desert of California, eastward.

Full sun.

Tolerates heat, frost, wind and drought.

Best with summer heat (but can grow near coast).

Needs excellent drainage. Can take some summer water.

Striking plant in flower and fruit. Feathery seed plumes glow in late afternoon light.
