

*Fremontodendron mexicanum*  
Mexican Flannelbush

LARGE SHRUB - evergreen.

6 - 15' high, 10'+ spread.

Sturdy upright growth. Branches from base.

Roundish leaves 2 to 3" in diameter. Rusty felt beneath.

Flowers yellow fading to orange - long blooming season in spring.

Native habitat: chaparral, southern oak woodland: dry canyons around 1500' - extreme southern San Diego County and adjacent Baja California.

Full sun to part shade in hot interior valleys.

Frost resistant.

Well-drained soil.

No summer water once established.

Fast growing accent, screen.

Good on slopes.
