Garrya elliptica Coast Tassel Bush

SHRUB, SMALL TREE, evergreen.

10 to 24' high, with equal spread.
Fairly slow-growing and usually smaller in cultivation.
Leaves are dark green, leathery,
lighter on under surface.
Separate male and female trees, male being showy.
Male flowers are long, silvery catkins - December to March.

Native habitat: coastal sage scrub, chaparral, forest below 2000'
- Coast Ranges from Santa Barbara to southern Oregon.

Full sun on the coast, part shade inland. Needs well-drained soil.
Water 2 - 4 x / month until established.

Any pruning should be just after flowering. Attractive at all times. Can be used as informal hedge, espalier or as a screen. Attracts birds.
