

Holodiscus discolor

Oceanspray

SHRUB, weeping — winter deciduous.

1-20' tall.

Bark can become red and shed with age.

Leaves simple, toothed, dull green.
Drooping clusters of flowers white/cream — May to August.

Native habitat: moist edge of woodlands, rocky slopes, below 10,500' — Pacific Northwest to Los Angeles area.

Part shade to full shade.

Frost tolerant.

Adaptable to garden soils.

Needs good drainage.

Water 2 x / month.

Flowers have faint sweet scent.

Attracts hummingbirds, bees and other beneficial insects.

Provides shelter for birds and other wildlife.

Prune to keep shape. Can form hedging.
