## Juncus mexicanus Mexican Rush

RUSH - perennial.
To 2' high, from rhizome.
Forming large tufts of rigid, spiny stems.

Stems often twisted.
Flowers inspicuous, brownish appearance — spring to summer; fruit August to November.

Native habitat: coastal salt marsh to montane meadows below 12500' — Oregon to South America, to New Mexico.

Full sun.
Needs wet soil.
Tolerates most soils as long as wet.

Low-maintenance, striking for moist area. Used in wetland revegetation and as formidable pedestrian barrier. Tough stems used in basketry.
