Justicia californica and horticultural selections Chuparosa

SMALL SHRUB, SUBSHRUB drought deciduous.
3 - 5' high, 6 - 8' spread.
Rounded, densely branched.
Small gray-green leaves.
Red tubular, two-lipped flowers — March to June and later.

Native habitat: sandy or rocky soils along washes and ravines, below 2500' edges of Sonoran desert to Baja California and Arizona.

Full sun.

Needs good drainage. May benefit from some irrigation inland.

Important for wildlife. Pollinated by hummingbirds. Very colorful.
