Lyonothamnus floribundus ssp. asplenifolius Fernleaf Catalina Ironwood

TREE - evergreen
20 - 35' high, 15' spread.
Slender, beautiful form.
Shredded red bark.
Fern-like palmate leaves.
Small white flowers — summer.

Native habitat: dry slopes and canyons below 2000'

— Channel Islands.

Full sun. Needs protection from hot drying winds.

Can tolerate heavy soil, but better with excellent drainage.

Drought resistant on coast once established. Can take moderate summer water.

Needs water inland.

Good in groves.
Grows rapidly if watered.
Best if natural leaf litter left in place.
Should be pruned in winter to shape and control growth.
