Monardella nana Yellow Monardella

SUBSHRUB — from rhizome. 2 - 12" high, forming a mat or tuft.

Gray/green, oval to round leaves.

Flower color varies, but often white to pale pink — May to August.

Native habitat: chaparral, woodland, slopes, 2500 - 8500' — Peninsular Range to Baja California.

Full sun to part shade. Water $1 - 2 \times 1$ month.

Good in rock garden. Attracts butterflies.

There are several subspecies, with a range of characteristics.
