Penstemon grinnellii Grinnell's Beardtongue

PERENNIAL, evergreen.

- 3' high, rounded with many branches.
- Greyish green, thick, stiff leaves, mainly low.
- Flowers on long stems, lavender to pink — May to August.
- Native habitat: chaparral, forest edges and dry woodlands higher elevations.

Full sun to part shade.Frost tolerant.Well-drained soil.Flowers longer with occasional to moderate water.

Pollinated by carpenter bees, but visited by many other insects. Sweet perfume prior to being pollinated.
