

Penstemon grinnellii

Grinnell's Beardtongue

PERENNIAL, evergreen.

3' high, rounded with many branches.

Greyish green, thick, stiff leaves, mainly low.

Flowers on long stems, lavender to pink — May to August.

Native habitat: chaparral, forest edges and dry woodlands — higher elevations.

Full sun to part shade.

Frost tolerant.

Well-drained soil.

Flowers longer with occasional to moderate water.

Pollinated by carpenter bees, but visited by many other insects.

Sweet perfume prior to being pollinated.
