

Pinus coulteri

Coulter Pine

TREE - CONIFER, evergreen
30 - 65' high, 25 - 40' wide.
Needles dull, blue-green, 5 - 12"
long, 3/bundle.

Cones massive, 9 - 12" long,
with hard, sharp scales.

Native habitat: chaparral,
foothill woodland, yellow
pine forests - dry, rocky
slopes, 4000 - 7000' -
mountains from northern
Baja to central California,
with average rainfall 25 -
35"/year.

Full sun Frost resistant.
Well-drained soil.
Good inland.
Water 1 x / month once
established.

Moderate to fast growth. Resistant to
heat, drought, wind and smog.
