

Pinus lambertiana

Sugar Pine

WHITE PINE TREE,
evergreen.
To 100' high, trunk to 8'
diameter.
Needles in bundles of 5,
2-4.5" long
Cone is pendant, to 2' long.



Native habitat: yellow and
red pine forest;
mountainous areas
below 1050' —
Oregon to northern
Baja California.



Full sun to part shade.
Frost tolerant.
Adaptable to soil types.
Does not require much
water.
