

Pinus monophylla

Singleleaf Piñon Pine

PINE TREE, evergreen.
To 50' high, trunk to 16"
diameter.

Usually 1 gray-green needle per
bundle, 0.75-2.75" long.
Cone is spreading, 1.25-4.75"
long.

Native habitat: Piñon/Juniper
woodland; mountainous
areas below 950' — Sierra
Nevada to southern coastal
ranges, to northern Baja
California and southeast
Idaho.

Full sun to part shade.
Frost tolerant.
Tolerates sand, sandstone, clay,
alkaline soils.
No water needed once
established.

Very slow growing.
Pine nuts are edible (produced after 20
years).
