Quercus palmeri Desert Oak, Palmer's Oak

SHRUB OR SMALL TREE - evergreen.

6 - 9' (to 18') high, twigs spreading.

Branches reddish brown.

- Stiff, leathery leaves have wavy edges with sharp spine teeth. Upper sides olive green and under side gray green with hairs.
- Flowers April to May. Acorns blunt-ended, 0.75 to 1.25" long and in a hairy cap 1" wide.

Native habitat: Rocky slopes and flats - 1000' - 5000' - Inner North Coast Range, South Coast Ranges, Desert Mountains to Arizona and Baja California.

Full sun. Drought tolerant. Needs good drainage.

Suitable for xeriscaping. Hybridizes with *Quercus chrysolepis*. Good wildlife habitat.
