## Salvia spathacea

## Pitcher Sage, Hummingbird Sage

PERENNIAL with creeping rhizomes. 1 - 3' high, 1 - 3' spread.

Leaves deep green, large (4 to 6" long).

Flowers deep rose on tall spikes - March to May.

Native habitat: chaparral, oak woodland; grassy and shady slopes below 2000' - coast ranges from Orange County to central California.

Shade - best under trees, except on immediate coast.

Drought tolerant once established, but tolerates summer water.

Can be used as a groundcover.

Good in mixed borders and under trees
(grows naturally as understory to oaks).

Favorite of hummingbirds.

Aromatic.
