HERBACEOUS PERENNIAL

1 - 2' high.

Leaves round, aromatic.

Flowers white to lavender to purple - March to May.

Native habitat: chaparral - rocky canyons 1500 to 2500' - Jamul and San Miguel Mountains in San Diego County, and Santa Monica Mountains.

Full sun to part shade.

Can tolerate water.

Edible leaves (tasty in salads).

Excellent shade groundcover, e.g. under oaks.

RARE — CNPS List: 1B.2

(Rare, threatened or endangered in California and elsewhere. Fairly endangered in California).
