

Senecio flaccidus var. *douglasii* (*Senecio douglasii*) Sand-Wash Butterweed

SUBSHRUB, evergreen.

To 3' high.

Gray-green color from hairy stems
and leaves.

Leaves mainly basal.

Yellow flowers, 1" diameter — June
to October.

Native habitat: disturbed, dry, sandy
or rocky areas; coastal sage
scrub, chaparral, grassland,
woodland below 5000' — west
of Sierra Nevada, north coast
range to northern San Diego
county. Also in Baja California.

Full sun to low shade.

Sandy or rocky soil.

No water needed once established.

Great for butterflies.
