

Solanum wallacei

Catalina Nightshade, Wallace's Nightshade

HERBACEOUS SUBSHRUB

2 - 3' high, 3' spread. Much branched.

Leaves gray-green.

Showy pale purple flowers - spring into summer.

Greenish berries.

Native habitat: chaparral in canyons below 2500'

- Santa Catalina Island, Guadalupe Island, Mexico.

Full sun to part shade.

Needs good drainage.

Drought tolerant but will bloom longer with water.

Long flowering season.

Poisonous.

(Rare, threatened or endangered in California and elsewhere. Seriously endangered in California). Federally Endangered.
