Agave shawii

Shaw's Agave

SUCCULENT - evergreen.

2 - 3' diameter rosette. Old plants have a short thick trunk.

Leaves thick and fleshy; have curved red prickles on margins and a long, very sharp spiny tip.

Flowers yellow-green, 2' bells on tall, wide spikes - 3 to 10' high, 2 to 3' wide - on old plants. September to May.

Native habitat: coastal sage scrub

- coastal bluffs and dry slopes
- Baja California to Point Loma.

Full sun.

Can grow on sandy or heavy soil; tolerates alkaline soil.

Drought tolerant.

Good accent plant for large xeriscape area.
