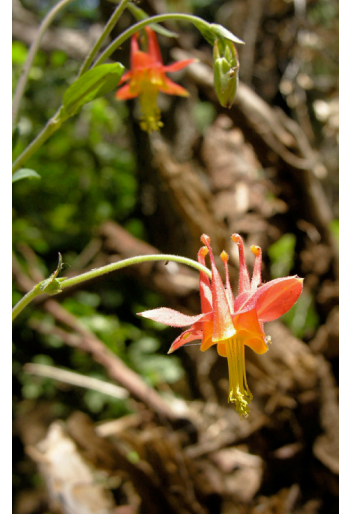


Aquilegia formosa

HERBACEOUS PERENNIAL (overwinters as a basal leaf cluster)
2 - 3' high, 2' across.
Small blue-green leaves.
Flowers red-orange with yellow center, spurs - June to August.

Native habitat: moist places in chaparral, oak woodland, mixed-evergreen or coniferous forest, below 9000' from Alaska to Baja California and Montana.

Light shade to shade. Frost resistant.
Best in peat-moss amended soil with acidic leaf-mold mulch.
Regular water (4x/month) with moist soil. Good drainage.

Easy to grow. Good in shady borders and as understory with ferns. Blooms abundantly with summer water. Attracts hummingbirds and butterflies.
