CACTUS

Plants generally are spreading with many stems forming a dense clump to 8' high.

Stems are cylindrical to 2.5" diameter with very many spines sometimes known as Velvet Cactus.

Flowers are yellow with green midveins - May to June. Fruit starts off fleshy but dries quite quickly.

Native habitat: Dry hillsides along the coast, below 300' in San Diego County and Baja California.

Full sun.

Sandy soil. Does not need water.

Threatened by development, collecting and feral goats.
