LOW SHRUB, GROUNDCOVER - evergreen.

1 - 3' high, 6' spread.

Leaves small, thick, glossy green above, woolly white beneath. Flowers pale blue - January to March.

Native habitat: Coastal bluffs, coastal sage scrub below 500' - San Louis Obispo County.

Full sun on coast, to part shade inland. Frost resistant. Not heat or drought tolerant.

Water 1 - 2 x/month once established.

Good on banks, in rock gardens and as a groundcover near the coast.
