SUCCULENT - evergreen

Rosette, 6 - 12" up to 20" across. Forms clumps.

Silvery green fleshy leaves covered with white mealy powder.

Pale red flowers on spikes to 2' long - May to July.

Native habitat: coastal sage scrub, chaparral - rocky cliffs and canyons below 3000' - southern coastal California to north coastal Baja California.

Full sun, but prefers part shade. Frost tolerant.

Drought tolerant. Little summer water - not overhead. Needs some water if potted.

Attractive accent plant. Good in rock gardens and in containers. Plant on angle to avoid water accumulation in center of rosette.

Attracts hummingbirds, butterflies.
