## Coast Sunflower, Bush Sunflower

PERENNIAL SUBSHRUB - evergreen.

3' high, 4' spread.

Bright green leaves.

Spectacular bloom of yellow daisy flowers, about 2" diameter -  
February to June.

Native habitat: Coastal sage scrub or chaparral below 2000.'

Full sun to part shade.

Tolerates coastal conditions.

Excellent on slopes for erosion control. Combine with *Salvias*, *Ceanothus* or  
*Rhus*.

Recommend cutting back to the ground annually to keep from getting too  
woody or leggy.

*Encelia californica* will hybridize with *Encelia farinosa*. You should not plant  
these two species together if you live near a wild or natural area. Plant  
the species that is appropriate for your location. Please consult with one
