SUBSHRUB - evergreen. 3' high, 4' spread. Silvery white leaves. Yellow daisy flowers - spring.

Native habitat: Colorado, eastern Mojave desert, southwest Utah, Arizona and northwestern Mexico. Native to San Diego County, but generally **only** in Anza-Borrego desert.

Full sun.

Well drained soil. Best inland but will tolerate coastal conditions.

Little to no summer water once established.

Do not plant this species near the coast, where there are wild populations of *Encelia californica* (Coast Sunflower). It will hybridize with wild populations of *Encelia californica*.
