WOODY PERENNIAL - evergreen.

2' high, 3 - 4' spread.

Compact, low growing; many-branched.

Small gray-green leaves.

Dark pink flowers on thick stalks - summer to fall. Flowers turn rust brown with age.

Native habitat: coastal sage scrub on bluffs and cliffs - San Miguel and Santa Cruz Islands.

Full sun to part shade.

Water 1 - 2 x /month once established. Sensitive to summer water on poorly draining soils.

Good for borders, rock gardens, small banks and planters.
