Coastal or Sea-cliff Buckwheat

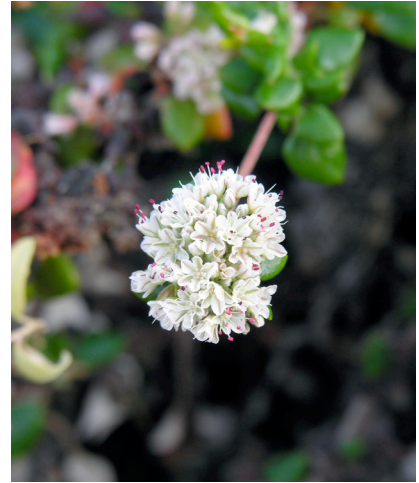
WOODY SUBSHRUB, PERENNIAL

- evergreen.

1 - 2' high, 4 - 6'+ spread; prostrate.

Small spoon-shaped leaves, green
(turning red) above, white beneath.

Clusters of creamy pink-white flowers
on stalks, turn rich brown by end of
summer.

Native habitat: coastal strand, coastal
sage scrub - bluffs and dunes along
the coast - Monterey to San Diego.



Full sun to part shade.

Tolerant of salt spray.

Very drought tolerant. Can do with or
without water (1 - 2 x/month).

Good in rock gardens and for slope stabilization
along coast.

Attracts hummingbirds, butterflies.
