
Hazardia squarrosa Saw-toothed Goldenbush

SMALL SUBSHRUB, SHRUB 1-3' high Prickly, resinous leaves.

Small tawny-yellow composite flowers, tinged red, pappus white to reddish-brown—August to November.

Native habitat: coastal bluffs, montane canyons and ridges, up to 2200 feet—coastal sage scrub and chaparral (Monterey to northern Baja California).

Full sun. Needs good drainage. May benefit from some irrigation.

Late season bloomer, providing late season color.
