Nolina parryi

Parry's Nolina, Parry Beargrass

PERENNIAL - evergreen.

3' high, 5' high flower stalk; 3 - 6' wide. Thick woody trunk with age.

Dense crown of narrow, rigid, gray-green leaves with sharp edges and spiny tips.

Dense flower clusers on tall stalk - May to June.

Native habitat: pinon juniper woodland, 3500' - 5500' - Little San Bernadino and Chuckwalla Mountains, scattered in Upper and Lower Sonoran Zones in Arizona, western margin of Colorado Desert, south to northern Baja California.

Full sun. Frost tolerant. Good drainage. Drought tolerant.

Rock gardens. Good accent plant away from high traffic areas.
