PERENNIAL (occasionally ANNUAL) To 4' high, to 3' spread.

Large bright green leaves.

Composite flowers purple/pink - late summer to early winter.

Native habitat: moist and alkaline valley bottoms (desert and coastal) under 1000' - San Francisco to southern coastal California, e.g. estuaries.

Full sun to part shade. Drought deciduous. Tolerates salty or alkaline soil. Water 4 x /month

Wonderful late-season color. Good as an accent plant for borders, e.g. mixed with *Mimulus guttatus, Carex and Juncus*. Cut back after flowering. Good around pond or in low-lying areas with poor drainage.

Attracts native bees.
