Quercus agrifolia Coast Live Oak

LARGE TREE - evergreen.

20 - 40'+ high. Spreading crown. Small dark leaves - cupped with prickly edges.

Pollen-producing flowers in pale yellowish cakins in spring. Tiny female flowers in leaf axis. Long, slender acorns.

Native habitat: chaparral, riparian, southern oak and foothill woodland - valleys and not too dry slopes below 3000' - throughout California.

Full sun. Frost resistant.

Water regularly during dry seasons until well established then little or none. Try to avoid wetting trunk.

Beautiful specimen tree. Can grow to 30 feet or more in about 15 years. Acorns attract birds and small animals.

Growing near a lawn is likely to shorten the tree's life.
