

Ribes sanguineum var. *glutinosum*

Red Flowering Currant

SHRUB - deciduous.
3 - 8' high, 5' spread.
Erect, vase-shaped form.
Dark green lobed leaves.
Dark pink to dark red flowers in
3 to 6 inch clusters - spring.
Edible blue-black berries.

Native habitat: open places and
among brush and trees
in chaparral, woodland,
closed-cone pine forest
below 2500' - Coast ranges
Santa Barbara to Del Norte
counties and Oregon.

Full sun to part shade.
Frost resistant.
Adaptable to soil type.
Water 1 - 2 x /month will result
in fuller growth.

Good in woodland garden or under
trees such as California sycamore
or alders.

Attracts birds.
