Salix exigua Sandbar Willow, Narrow-leaf Willow



SMALL TREE OR LARGE SHRUB - deciduous. 6 to 10' high, 10' spread. Forms clumps by root-sprouting. Gray bark.

Leaves gray-green, silky (especially young leaves). Catkins relatively small - spring to summer.

Native habitat: Streamsides, marshes, wet areas - below 7500' - throughout western US, to Arizona and Baja California.

Full sun to part shade. Frost tolerant.

Needs water when young, drought tolerant when established.

Can be used as a screen. Good as light-colored background or foreground for other plants. Excellent adjacent to lawns. Responds well to pruning. Habitat for birds, butterflies and insects. Many ethnobotanical uses.
