

*Salvia brandegeei*  
Brandegee's Sage

SMALL SHRUB - evergreen.

3 - 4' high, 4' spread.

Linear, slightly crinkly leaves are dark green above, whitish, hairy beneath. Aromatic.

Small lavender to pale blue flowers - spring.

Native habitat: chaparral, coastal sage scrub, closed-cone pine forest; dry places, coastal canyons and hills below 500' - Santa Rosa Island, n. Baja California.

Full sun to part shade.

Frost resistant.

Will tolerate sand or clay.

Water 1 x /month.

Good for attracting hummingbirds, butterflies.

Good for fragrance.
