HERBACEOUS PERENNIAL

2' high (plus flower stems), 2' wide. Mostly erect. From short rootstock.

Foliage similar to maidenhair fern.

Flowers small, intricate, on stalks 3' to 8' tall - spring.

Native habitat: southern oak woodland, chaparral, etc. below 10,000' - along streams, in cool canyons and meadows, and on brushy slopes - San Diego County to Columbia River.

Part shade to full shade. Frost resistant.

Likes moist soil. Water 2 - 4 x/month.

Great woodland effect. Good under oaks.
