



## Q2 Was this your first time on a CNPS-San Diego garden tour?



### Q3 How did you find your way to most of the gardens? Please check the one(s) you relied on the most:







### Q7 Would you describe your use or planned use of native plants as:



### Q8 Did you think the Garden Tour was a good value for the price paid for a ticket?


