Garden Native Sponsorship Contract

April 1-2, 2017 Garden Native Tour

September 2017 Garden Native Workshop

AN AGREEMENT made on the 1st day of April, 2017 between the California Native Plant Society San Diego Chapter, (hereinafter referred to as "CNPS") and the City of San Diego (hereinafter referred to as "Sponsor").

WHEREBY IT IS AGREED

1. In consideration of the agreement by the Sponsor to pay the CNPS the sum of \$10,000 to sponsor the CNPS Garden Native Tour and Workshop, the CNPS agrees to provide the credits and benefits set out in paragraph 2 below.
2. Credits and benefits to Sponsor for the Think Blue's sponsorship includes the following:
 - i. Prominent sponsor recognition on all Garden Native Tour and Workshop promotional materials: company logo/link on Garden Native and CNPS San Diego websites and on event flyers, posters, guidebook/program, and media spots.
 - ii. Full-page, black & white advertisement on inside front cover of guidebook
 - iii. Full-page black & white ad inside Workshop program. Workshop will be held in September 2017.
 - iv. Sponsor table at Tour registration area at Southwestern College's South Bay Botanic Garden where you can display outreach and educational materials. We will be in touch with you to coordinate.
 - v. Sponsor table at Workshop check-in area where you can display outreach and educational materials. We will be in touch with you to coordinate.
3. Twenty (20) complimentary Tour tickets and 6 Workshop tickets for Sponsor's employees and guests. Tour Brochures will be delivered to your office one week before the tour.
4. Payment of the sum of \$10,000 shall be made in full not later than the 1st day of August, 2017.

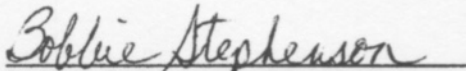

5. Other Agreements

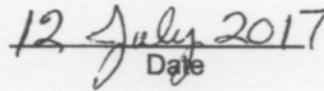
- a. It is agreed that all matters relating to the administration of the sponsorship shall remain the exclusive responsibility of the CNPS.

General Instructions

Future developments. Information about developments affecting Form W-9 (such as legislation enacted after we release it) is at www.irs.gov/fw9.

Purpose of Form

An individual or entity (Form W-9 requester) who is required to file an information return with the IRS must obtain your correct taxpayer identification number (TIN) which may be your social security number (SSN), individual taxpayer identification number (ITIN), adoption taxpayer identification number (ATIN), or employer identification number (EIN), to report on an information return the amount paid to you, or other amount reportable on an information return. Examples of information returns include, but are not limited to, the following:

- Form 1099-INT (interest earned or paid)
- Form 1099-DIV (dividends, including those from stocks or mutual funds)
- Form 1099-MISC (various types of income, prizes, awards, or gross proceeds)
- Form 1099-B (stock or mutual fund sales and certain other transactions by brokers)
- Form 1099-S (proceeds from real estate transactions)
- Form 1099-K (merchant card and third party network transactions)

- Form 1098 (home mortgage interest), 1098-E (student loan interest), 1098-T (tuition)
 - Form 1099-C (canceled debt)
 - Form 1099-A (acquisition or abandonment of secured property)
- Use Form W-9 only if you are a U.S. person (including a resident alien), to provide your correct TIN.

If you do not return Form W-9 to the requester with a TIN, you might be subject to backup withholding. See What is backup withholding? on page 2.

By signing the filled-out form, you:

1. Certify that the TIN you are giving is correct (or you are waiting for a number to be issued).
2. Certify that you are not subject to backup withholding, or
3. Claim exemption from backup withholding if you are a U.S. exempt payee. If applicable, you are also certifying that as a U.S. person, your allocable share of any partnership income from a U.S. trade or business is not subject to the withholding tax on foreign partners' share of effectively connected income, and
