Chilopsis linearis 'Maggie's Pink' Maggie's Pink Desert Willow

TREE

15-25' high, to 15' wide. Willow-like, weeping, typically multitrunked. Leaves linear, curved 5-10"; winter

deciduous. Flowers in terminal racemes, fragrant, vibrant shades of pink.

Native Habitat: Sandy desert washes. Northern Mexico to Utah, New Mexico, Arizona and southeast California.

Full sun.

Best in sandy soils, but tolerates less well-drained soils. Does best with moderate summer water: think monsoon rains.

Fast grower. Attracts hummingbirds and bees. Can be pruned to single trunk.
