Diplacus aurantiacus (Mimulus aurantiacus) Bush Monkeyflower

WOODY SUBSHRUB

To 5' high, 3 - 5' wide. Sticky leaves. Blooms profusely in spring; light bloom again in fall. Flower color yellow-orange to orange.

Horticultural selections may be cream to red, due to prior taxonomic confusion and hybridization.

Native Habitat: northern and central western California and Sierra Nevada foothills to Santa Barbara Co. <2500'.

Full sun on coast to partial shade inland. Well drained soil. Water while flowering, 1-2x/month in summer, at most.

Attractive to many pollinators, including hummingbirds.
