## **GARDENS**

- Entry to 15 private residential gardens staffed with interpretive docents, owners, and designers.
- 3 additional FYI (For Your Inspiration) viewing gardens on the route.
- The Kumeyaay Ipai Interpretive Center at Pauwai: 4 guided private tours of this native plant ethnobotany garden will be offered for an additional fee on Sunday only.
- Instructional presentations and plantings on Saturday and Sunday.

## **TICKETS**

- Tickets on sale online beginning February 14. Tour tickets are \$30 online, \$35 at door. Tickets give attendees admission on both days of the tour.
- All participants buying online before April 6th will have a tour booklet mailed to their address within the week preceding the Tour so that they can begin the tour at any garden location during Tour weekend.
- Guided tours of The Kumeyaay Ipai Interpretive Center at Pauwai are a separate \$10 admission.
